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What Has Changed?

- Flash Flood Watch Issued
- Increased winds for portions of VT









Overview

- ✓ Flash Flood Watch for Essex County, NY and all of VT, except Grand Isle County
- ✓ The threat for localized flash flooding due to very high rainfall rates has increased, especially across urban areas with poor drainage and complex terrain
- ✓ Rain will develop on Tuesday and become heavy at times by late Tuesday afternoon into Tuesday night, especially eastern Adirondacks into Vermont.
- ✓ Storm total rainfall of 1-3" expected with isolated higher amounts are possible for central, eastern and southern VT.
- ✓ Sharp rises on streams and rivers are possible for eastern Adirondacks into Vermont, but significant river flooding is not expected.
- ✓ Localized wind gusts up to 45 mph expected on Tuesday Night across the southern Green Mountains and portions of eastern VT, with isolated power outages possible

| Flash Flooding | Localized flash flooding with culvert and dirt road washouts possible, along with poor drainage urban flooding | Eastern Adirondacks into most of Vermont | Late Tuesday into Tuesday night |
| Wind | Isolated power outages possible | Eastern Vermont and southern portions of the Green Mountains | 4 PM to Midnight on Tuesday |


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Monday Morning Satellite View

- ✓ Isaias is a Tropical Storm with maximum sustained winds near 70 mph, as of 5 AM Monday.
- ✓ Isaias is expected to be near hurricane strength Today
- ✓ For our region, it important not to become focused on near-term fluctuations in intensity.










Latest NHC Advisory



- Isaias was near the South Carolina Coast at 5 am Monday.
- Isaias is expected to track northward, and the forward motion will increase today into Tuesday.
- Rain will develop on Tuesday and become heavy at times by Tuesday afternoon into Tuesday night, especially from the Eastern Adirondacks into most of Vermont.








Flash Flood Watch

- ✓ Flash flood watch from 2
 PM Tuesday until 11 AM
 Weds
- Essex County, NY and all of VT, except Grand Isle County
- ✓ 1 to 3 inches of rain with isolated higher amounts possible
- Localized flash flooding possible












Rainfall Forecast (Tuesday through Wednesday)

- ✓ Storm total rainfall of 1-3" with localized higher amounts possible for eastern, central and southern VT
- ✓ When: Tuesday into Tuesday night
- Any change in the forecast track would shift the heavy rainfall axis.












Potential Flooding Impacts – Urban and Flash Flooding

- ✓ Urban street flooding, ponding of water on low-lying roads, clogged storm drains.
- ✓ Washed out culverts and washed out dirt road shoulders/roads
- ✓ Very heavy rainfall rates over any given location can lead to localized Flash Flooding, especially highly sloped, small drainage basins and urban areas.
- ✓ Sharp rises on streams and rivers expected, but widespread river flooding is low






















Wind Impacts

- Localized gusts up to 45 mph possible
- ✓ Eastern Vermont and portions of the southern Green Mountain
- Isolated power outages possible
- ✓ Highest gusts between 4 PM and Midnight on Tuesday







Isaias Impacts

- ✓ Flash Flood Watch for Essex County, NY and all of VT, except Grand Isle County from 2 PM Tuesday to 11 AM Wednesday
- ✓ The threat for localized flash flooding due to very high rainfall rates has increased, especially across urban areas with poor drainage and complex terrain
- ✓ Storm total rainfall of 1 to 3" with localized higher amounts possible for central, eastern and southern VT.
- ✓ Sharp rises on streams and rivers are possible, but widespread river flooding is not expected.
- ✓ Localized wind gusts up to 45 mph with isolated power outages possible for eastern VT and southern Green Mountains
- ✓ The eventual track of Isaias will influence where the axis of heaviest rainfall occurs.
