INPATIENT and RESIDENTIAL services and treatment: Bridge Program, Burlington, VT 802-488-6425 Supervised detox from alcohol and other substances; stay up to 4 nights/5 days days. Coordination with treatment programs provided. Call 24/7 for screening, decision and intake scheduling in 1-2 days. Brattleboro Retreat, Brattleboro, VT 802-258-3700, 800-738-7328 Inpatient treatment for acute mental health and co-occurring crises. Call 24/7. Serenity House, Wallingford, VT 0 802-446-2640 Medically assisted withdrawal from alcohol and other substances; residential rehabilitation for substance-use and co-occurring disorders. Residential treatment for those with substance use disorder. Private insurance only; does not accept Medicaid.

Supervised environment to regain sobriety from alcohol intoxication, usually overnight. Assistance provided to locate treatment for substance-use disorders and mental health counseling services.
