



## OVERVIEW:

- On New Year's Day, precipitation is expected to transition from snow, then to sleet and/or freezing rain, and then rain.
- Transition of precipitation type likely late in the day into the overnight hours.
- Please continue to monitor this situation for additional details.

<b>TIMING</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Light snow will be possible in the afternoon.</li><li>▪ A mix of sleet/freezing rain is more likely late New Year's Day and into the overnight hours. The transition to rain takes place early Saturday morning.</li></ul>
<b>HAZARDS &amp; IMPACTS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Slick travel is the most likely impact.</li></ul>
<b>FORECAST CHALLENGES</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ It is a complex forecast pattern, but stronger than usual signals for potential ice accumulations are present.</li></ul>
